

ELEMENTARY DRESS CODE

2009-2010

PLEASE NOTE the following changes for the 2009-2010 school year:

- * The Red polos, turtlenecks & sweaters will be phased out after the '09-'10 school year. Students will still be allowed to wear the red shirts through this school year. Black shirts have been added to the dress code.
- * On Fridays – Students may wear the approved school spirit wear T-Shirts. No shirts with handwriting or signatures are allowed including fundraising t-shirts.
- * **Coming Soon:** A new line of FACS “Spirit Wear”

UNIFORMS - All students must wear uniforms that meet the school’s accepted guidelines for shirts, blouses, skirts, skorts, capris or pants.

Short and Long Sleeve Polos - White, Navy Blue, Vegas Gold, Black & Red

Turtleneck Shirts - White, Navy Blue, Vegas Gold, Black & Red

Sweatshirts - (Must be worn with a polo, turtleneck or oxford)
White, Navy Blue, Vegas Gold

Round or V-Neck Cardigan Sweaters or Sweater Vests -
(must be worn with an approved collard shirt) - White, Navy Blue, Black & Red

Short or Long Sleeve Oxford Shirts - White, Light Blue or Denim

Short or Long Sleeve Girls Peter Pan Blouses - White

Pants, Skirts, Skorts, Shorts, Culottes, Capris - All of these must be Navy or Khaki (tan), (not stonewashed white or light beige). All skirts must be knee length or longer. Shorts-(Boys 4K-5th) must be finger tip or longer. **Girls in 4K-5th grades will wear Capris, Bermuda shorts or knee-length skorts.**

* Students in grades 3-5 must have all shirts and blouses tucked in.

* Belts - Belts should be worn with any uniform piece that is equipped with belt loops for students in grades 4 & 5. Belts do not have to be purchased from the uniform company but should be a plain brown or black type belt.

Jumpers - All jumpers must be solid Khaki or Navy, they may be round neck or V-neck.

Shoes - Shoes must be worn, but do not have to be purchased from the uniform company. Shoes may be different types and styles, but flip flops and thong type shoes are not permitted. Sandals must have a strap across the heel.

Jackets, Coats - Only school approved sweaters or sweat shirts are to be worn in the school classrooms. Outer wear such as coats and jackets do not have to be uniformed, but should not be worn in the classrooms.

Hair - Unnatural or unusual hair dying (e.g. purple, green, blue, etc.) and unconventional haircuts are not permitted. Hair is to be neat and clean. In determining “neat & clean” the administration will look at the eyebrows, the earlobe and the collar.

NOTE: No **cargo pants or shorts**, bell bottoms or **hipsters** and no name brand labels may be worn.

Middle School Dress Code 2009-2010

PLEASE NOTE the following changes for the 2009-2010 school year:

- The Red polos, turtlenecks & sweaters will be phased out after the '09-'10 school year. Students will still be allowed to wear the red shirts through this school year. Black shirts have been added to the dress code.
- On Fridays – Students may wear the approved school spirit wear T-Shirts and jeans. No fundraising t-shirts.
- Athletes may wear their game jerseys with a school uniform bottom on game days.

All students must abide by the following dress code guidelines.

Short and Long Sleeve Polos –White, Navy Blue, Vegas Gold, Black & Red

Turtleneck Shirts –White, Navy Blue, Vegas Gold, Black & Red

Sweatshirts – (Must be worn with a polo, turtleneck or oxford)
White, Navy Blue or Vegas Gold.

Round or V-Neck Cardigan Sweaters or Sweater Vests –
(must be worn with an approved collard shirt) –White, Navy Blue, Black & Red

Short or Long Sleeve Oxford shirts – White, Light Blue or Denim

Pants, skirts, shorts (bermuda type-knee length only) & Capri's for the girls. Boys may wear shorts and pants. - All of these must be Navy or Khaki (tan). All skirts and shorts must be knee length or longer when sitting or standing. Boys pants must be worn at the beltline.

- **Belts** – Belts should be worn with any uniform piece that is equipped with belt loops for students in grades 6 – 8. Belts should be a plain brown or black type belt.

Shoes – Shoes may be different types and styles, but flip flops and thong type shoes are not permitted. Sandals must have a strap across the heel.

Jackets, Coats – Only school approved sweaters or sweat shirts are to be worn in the school classrooms. Outer wear such as coats and jackets do not have to be uniformed, but should not be worn in the classrooms.

Hair – Unnatural or unusual hair dying (e.g. purple, green, blue, etc.) and unconventional haircuts are not permitted. Hair is to be neat and clean. In determining “neat & clean” the administration will look at the eyebrows, the earlobe and the collar. Boys are expected to be clean-shaven at all times.

NOTE: Inconspicuous brand labels may be worn. Clothing apparel may be purchased from Dan'elle's, Lee Clothing Warehouse, Wings III, Walmart, Target, Penny's, K-mart or ordered on line from Land's End (www.landsend.com/uniforms), 1-800-469-2222 or Educational Outfitters (includes logo) educationaloutfitters.com.

HIGH SCHOOL DRESS CODE

2008-2009

FEMALE STUDENTS

- Jeans are acceptable classroom attire if they are **not**: low riders, frayed, baggy, tight, or with holes. Pants cannot drag the floor, have cut seams and must be hemmed. Shorts are permitted if they are the Bermuda type shorts that reach all the way to the knees. No exceptions. Sweatpants, jogging pants and short pants are not permitted. Capri pants are permitted. No pocket chains.
- Shirts must **not** be tight, form fitting, revealing (such as belly shirts), sleeveless, cap sleeve, or have low necklines (necklines should not be lower than 2 inches below the neck in the front, back or on the sides). T-shirts, sweatshirts, tank tops and shirts with writing are not permitted. Under-garments must not be visible at any time. Layered-look is acceptable but not to be excessive.
- Dresses and skirts are acceptable classroom attire, but all dresses and skirts must cover the knee completely, with no slits higher than the bottom of the knee.
- No low riding belts or sashes (hanging below the hips) or fishnet nylons are permitted.
- Beach flip flops and athletic sandals are not permitted.
- Excessive jewelry is not permitted. Only two earrings per ear, two necklaces and three bracelets per arm may be worn at a time.
- Tattoo application is not permitted (permanent or temporary). If a student has a tattoo prior to enrolling at FACS this should be discussed at the time of enrolling. Body stickers are not permitted.
- Unnatural hair dying (e.g. purple, green, blue, etc.) and unconventional haircuts are not permitted. Hair is to be neat and clean.
- Body piercing, other than earrings, is not permitted.

MALE STUDENTS

- Jeans are acceptable classroom attire if they are not dragging the floor, frayed, baggy, tight, have holes or cut seams. Pants must be hemmed. No pocket chains.
- Sweatpants, athletic pants and jogging pants are not permitted.
- Overalls are not permitted.
- Collared or button-down shirts, turtlenecks, mock turtlenecks, and knit sweaters are acceptable classroom attire. T-shirts, sweatshirts, muscle shirts, and shirts that are tight or sloppy are not permitted.
- Wearing bandanas is not permitted.
- Beach flip flops and athletic sandals are not permitted.
- Unnatural or unusual hair dying (e.g. purple, green, blue, etc.) and unconventional haircuts are not permitted. Hair is to be neat and clean. In determining “neat & clean” the administration will look at the eyebrows, the earlobe and the collar. Boys are expected to be clean-shaven at all times.
- Tattoo application is not permitted (permanent or temporary). If a student has a tattoo prior to enrolling at FACS this should be discussed at the time of enrolling. Body stickers are not permitted.
- Earrings and body piercing are not permitted.

COATS, ETC.

- Coats and jackets may not be worn in the classrooms without a teacher’s permission. They must be placed in a locker when arriving at school. No coats with slogans may be worn on the school grounds (College or professional team jackets are acceptable). No army jackets or camouflage clothing may be worn.

HATS

- Hats and caps may not be worn in the building.

FRIDAY SPIRITWEAR

- Students are permitted to wear an approved school T-shirt on Fridays only. No other T-shirts are allowed.
